

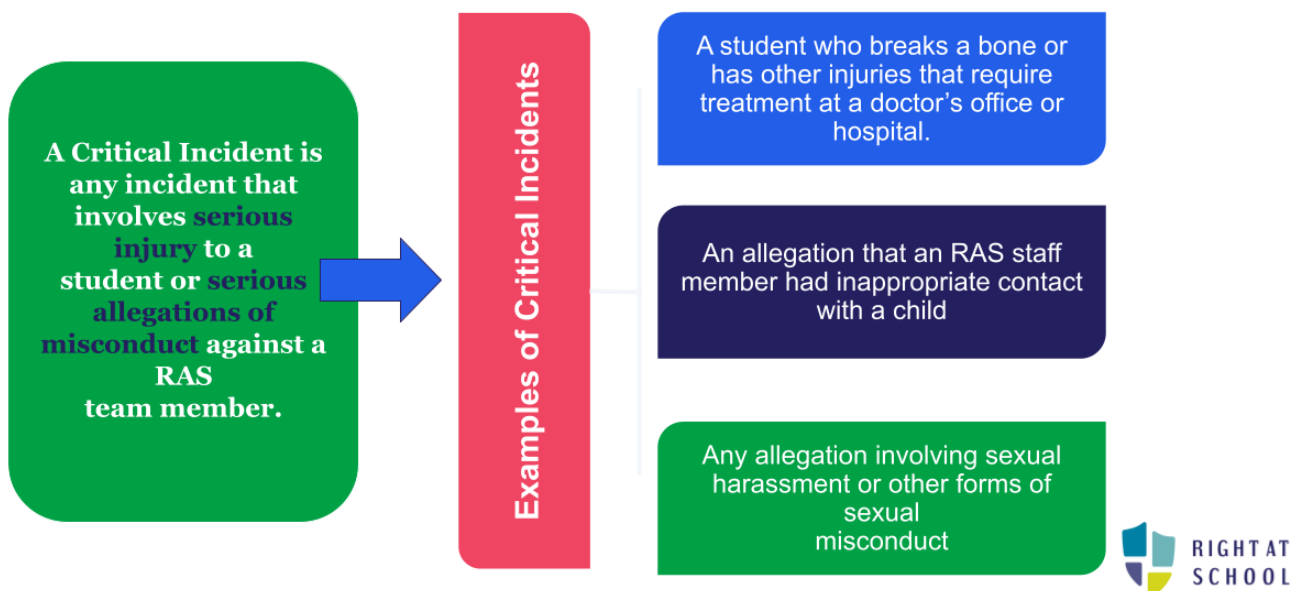
Rapid Response Reporting

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Overview

Rapid Response incidents require a cross functional team of leaders to support the resolution of the issue and are in the minority of all incidents that take place at RAS

Intake Forms

- Used to quickly gather essential information
- Ensures that all relevant details are communicated swiftly

Rapid Response Team

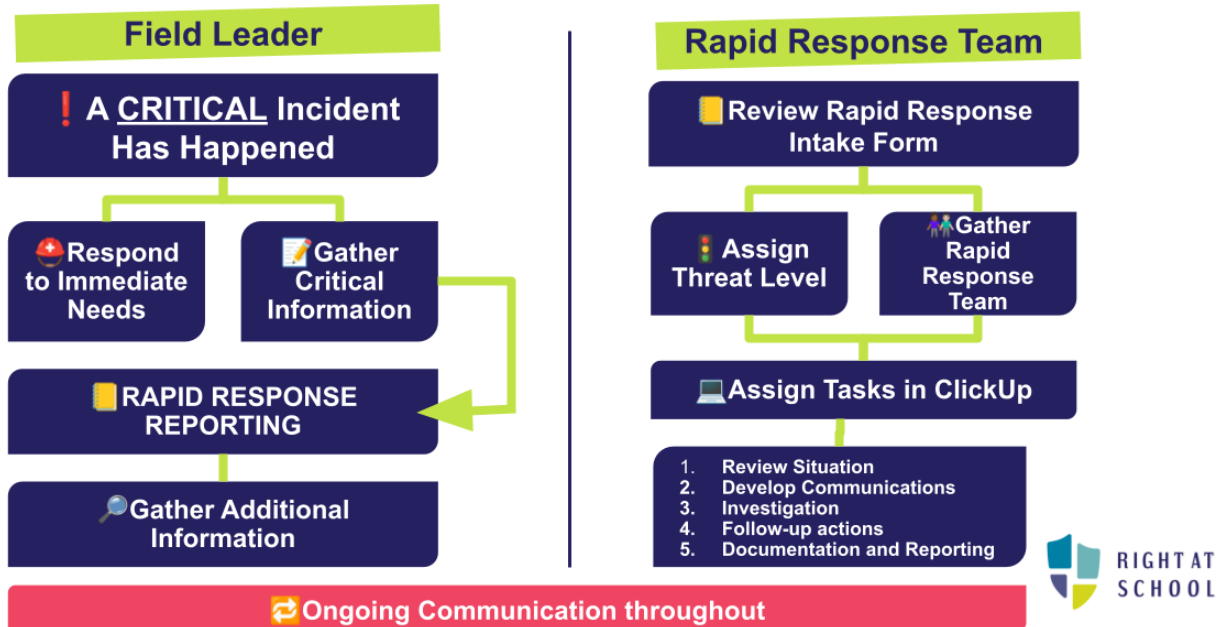
- Assign risk levels
- Coordinate between different stakeholders ensuring a cohesive and effective response
- Involved in follow-up actions, such as debriefing, reporting, and reviewing the incident to improve future responses.

Together...

Altercations

What defines an altercation?

An altercation is considered to be an escalating situation characterized by actual or threatened physical violence, including the presence of weapons (e.g. guns, knives, bats, scissors, etc.)

The Rapid Response Intake Forms are designed to quickly gather essential information during or following a critical incident. This form is designed to be concise and efficient, and will guide you in collecting critical details rapidly to ensure an appropriate and timely response. The goal is for the Rapid Response team to support you!

Child/Staff Incidents

Missing Child

What defines a missing child?

A situation where a child is unaccounted for and cannot be located, requiring immediate action to ensure their safety and return.

Death or Serious Injury to a Child or Staff Member Intake Form

What defines a serious injury?

A serious injury typically involves harm or damage to the body that requires immediate medical attention and may result in significant consequences if left untreated. Serious injuries can vary in severity but generally pose a risk to the individual's health, safety, or well-being.

Examples include:

- Suspected or Confirmed Concussion
- Suspected or Confirmed Broken Bone
- Any medical emergency where 911 is called
- Hospitalization
- Administration of CPR
- Loss of Consciousness
- Major burn or bleeding
- Ingestion of toxic materials
- Serious allergic reaction, anaphylactic shock (ex: use of Epi Pen)
- Sexual assault

Harassment

What defines harassment?

Harassment is defined as unwanted behavior, whether verbal, physical, or online, that creates a hostile or intimidating environment for students or staff.

Child Grooming

What defines child grooming?

Child grooming is defined as inappropriate and manipulative behavior by an adult towards a child with the intent of establishing an exploitative or abusive relationship.

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Report a Child Grooming allegation

Media Exposure

What is media exposure?

Media exposure is defined as negative public attention or coverage by media outlets or social media regarding an event or issue related to RAS.

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Report Media Exposure

Serious Event/Outbreak

Serious School Event

What defines a serious school event?

A serious school event is defined as a critical incident that occurrence within the associated school, such as lockdowns, emergencies, or other significant events that would affect the RAS program.

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Report a Serious School Event

Health Outbreak

What defines a health outbreak?

A health outbreak is defined as the spread of illness or disease within the school or program, requiring health protocols, communication with parents, and possible closure.

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Report a Health Outbreak

Discrimination

What defines discrimination?

Discrimination is defined as unfair treatment of individuals based on race, gender, disability, or other protected characteristics, necessitating corrective action and policy enforcement.

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Report Discrimination

Data Integrity

What defines data integrity?

Data integrity is defined as the accuracy, consistency, and reliability of data within the program, crucial for decision-making and regulatory compliance.

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Report a breach in Data Integrity

Financial Risk

What defines financial risk?

Financial risk is defined as potential threats to the financial stability of the organization, such as fraud, embezzlement, theft or financial mismanagement.

Regulatory Risk

What defines a regulatory risk?

A regulatory risk is defined as risks associated with non-compliance with laws, regulations, and standards governing the organization.
